




## WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

#### WHERE WE ARE NOW







The overall goal of the Randol Mill Road and Woodhaven Boulevard sidewalks project is to provide a safe connection for all ages and abilities. Randol Mill is an arterial street that provides a regional connection for vehicles, bicycles, and pedestrians. It has a low level of walkability due to the lack of sidewalks, lighting, landscaping, and Americans with Disabilities (ADA) ramps.

Despite low levels of walkability,



pedestrian trips occur between the apartments on Woodhaven Boulevard and destinations along Bridgewood Drive, Bridge Street, and the I-820 Frontage Road every day.






#### **Proposed Solution Cross-Section**


#### We evaluated center running and south running options.

#### **Proposed Solution**

**Description**: Six-foot sidewalk with lighting and shrubs on north side of roadway.

#### **Benefits**

- Creates a pedestrian connection to the Trinity trail and Quanah Parker Park
- Improves safety with lighting and buffer to separate pedestrians from vehicles
- Improves accessibility for all ages and abilities with ADA ramps
- Improves walkability/ connectivity between apartments on Woodhaven Blvd. and opportunities along I-820 (grocery stores, restaurants, jobs, etc.)
- Leverages existing bridge over West Fork Trinity River tributary




#### Center-running Shareduse Path

**Description**: 10-foot shared use path in median with enhanced lighting and landscaping.

#### Why it was ruled out

- People using the pathway may be less visible to through vehicles.
- The high cost of relocating utilities running along the median.
- May need a separate pedestrian bridge to cross West Fork Trinity River tributary




#### Sidewalk on South side

**Description**: Six-foot Sidewalk with lighting and shrubs on south side of roadway.

#### Why it was ruled out

- Right-of-way is constrained throughout corridor
- Slope and grading issues
- The high cost of relocating utilities
- Retaining walls needed for various segments throughout the corridor






# PROPOSED SOLUTION FOR RANDOL MILL RD & WOODHAVEN BLVD





**Description**: Construct six-foot Sidewalk with landscaping on the north side of Randol Mill Road from Woodhaven Boulevard to the Exxon parking lot at 6635 Randol Mill Rd. Other enhancements also includes lighting, landscaping, and ADA accessible ramps.





**Description**: Extend five-foot sidewalk on the east side of Woodhaven Blvd. from Shady Lane Dr. to Randol Mill Rd. Other enhancements also includes lighting, landscaping, and ADA-accessible ramps. The sidewalk extension will improve connectivity and safety between the existing multifamily housing on Woodhaven Blvd. to Quanah Parker Park and the planned Randol Mill Rd. sidewalks.
